The thermal stopped working a little way over the back leaving them a glide down the valley, after just over 6km Richard had managed to sneak an extra 30 meters past Pete's landing to win the day. Sunday we set off for Dodd Fell on the strength of a westerly forecast, the task was set, TP1 Wether Fell and then open distance.
