Airwave British Clubs Challenge

HH of the Dales Club reports from the BCC finals 30 -31 August, at The Long Mynd:

The Dales team barely scraped into the finals. A combination of poor weather and strong competition meant we only just made it into the last slot to contest the BCC showdown. So we were pleased to have a reasonably flyable forecast at least for the Saturday to give us a sporting chance of a good result. The picturesque Shropshire countryside and the rolling hills of Mid Wales are ideal flying environment.

So on the Saturday we went to Gyrn Moelfre. The weather did not look promising to begin with. The fresh SSE wind and completely overcast sky with a warm humid haze did not inspire. At least there was decent ridge lift, so a task was set for an open distance with the top 4 pilots of each team scoring. We had a good team assembled under Kevin's captaincy with Tony, Ziggy, Pete, Ogi and I making up the six and Dave and Rich as backup. I took off immediately fearing it might get blown out at take off. There was easy ridge lift but weak wind-disrupted thermals were just teasing, giving no better than 500ft ATO then fizzling off. Those who tried going over the back on these thermal crumbs got drilled in the lee. Patience was the name of the game. After nearly two hours we could see that the sun was beginning to break through and the valley in front was getting warmed up. It started to release and those who caught this solitary elusive thermal got away. Fortunately for us, 4 of the Dales team caught the lift and were soon winding upwards to cloud base, at 3,500 ft AMSL. There was the first gaggle of about 3 gliders, I was on my own and a further gaggle of about 4 gliders. I found a particularly sucky bit of cloud and throttled the gas to fly out. Downwind however, was without buoyancy at all, so it was a death glide to terra firma. Kevin did particularly well on a later gaggle and found enough height to cross over to Llangollen and soared the far ridge, eventually registering 17 K, the best of the day. Tony and Ziggy along with some of the Wessex guys landed on a good field far side of the Welsh village of Glyn Ceiriog (10K). I too landed in Gly Ceiriog but, not having enough height to cross it, landed in the middle of the village football field while a game was in full pelt, to the bemusement of the assembled villagers! It was a one-thermal-wonder and with four of our team scoring points, we won the day.

Many thanks to Ken for excellent organisation. The hog roast and excellent ale rounded it off nicely. Sunday was driech and wet with no flying possible, so all that was left to be done was the presentation of the trophies and some assortment of goodies from Airwave, the BCC's generous sponsors.
